
Headed cabbage


# Pointed cabbage

# Savoy Cabbage

Savoy cabbage was only developed around the 16th century and historically used as a winter product. In most cases it can tolerate frost and snow very well. Hazera developed a range of savoy cabbage varieties with different maturing days, enabling harvesting of fresh produce over an extended period of time.

# Cauliflower

These edible flower buds are mentioned already in literature from the 1200's. In modern life this valuable crop is becoming increasingly interesting for its health attributes and diverse possibilities as an alternative to starchy foods. Never the less, good traditional style Cauliflower is still a winner on menus of many top chefs. Cauliflower is a key component in Hazera's Brassica portfolio, with high priority in our breeding programs.

# **Brussel Sprouts**

Brussels Sprouts is historically a Western European product and known to be grown in Belgium since the 13th century. Only in the 18th century was the crop introduced to the US with rapid growth in acreage since the 1940's. More than 80% of the production is grown for the frozen industry while modern health trends give new meaning to the crop as it's more recently used in smoothies and stir-fries. Hazera is proud of its high yielding varieties developed for both the fresh and processing markets.

## Broccoli

Broccoli is considered to be a valuable food since the times of the Roman Empire. It was only introduced to England in mid of the 17th century and became popular in the Americas from the early 1900's. Hazera focused on developing varieties with exceptional head quality and in recent years on varieties with good heat tolerance.
